There are many types of sea chanteys (see p.6). This chantey is Caribbean and was probably sung as a halyard chantey, to be sung while raising the sails. Chanteys usually have simple tunes and harmonies, which makes them great for improvising harmonies in group singing. And some pretty rowdy fun.
