In August, we remember Pioneer Inductee, Bradley Kincaid. He was born July 13th, 1895 in Garrard County, Kentucky. Kincaid was a Folk Singer, Radio Pioneer, and Songwriter. He grew up strumming folk tunes and mountain ballads on an old guitar his father had obtained in exchange for a foxhound. In 1926, he became the first big star of country music on Chicago's WLS and National Barn Dance, known as "The Kentucky Mountain Boy."

He received more than 100,000 fan letters a year, and when he moved to WLW in Cincinnati, he received 50,000 letters in his first month on the air. He published 13 songbooks that sold over 400,000 copies. For inspiration, he spent his summer vacations traveling the Appalachians and collecting ballads and folksongs from those who still sang them.

Kincaid later moved to Nashville and became a member of the Grand Ole Opry. His best-known recordings are, Barbara

Allen, The Fatal Derby Day, The Legend of the Robin's Red Breast, and the Letter Edged in Black. In 1971, he was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame. A BRIEF HISTORY OF CAJUN MUSIC

I included 'brief' in the title of this article, because there is so much that one could include in the history of this musical heritage. One could write a great deal about the accordions that have been used, as well as the many artists that one might include. So only a few are mentioned as they may rank high in the memory of those who deeply appreciate this form of music.

Cajun music originated from those who came to southern Louisiana from New Brunswick and Nova Scotia Canada in the 18th and 19th centuries. There are three elements of this musical style which characterize its style; the button accordion, the droning fiddle style, and the French language. This music is made for dancing in two-step or waltz rhythms. And while this music style was brought to Louisiana by the French Canadians, it evolved with the influence of the "Creoles". The term creole had several meanings over the years. In reference to Cajun music, it refers to the influence of the colonial French, African Americans and Native Americans that shaped this music through the early 20th century. The advent of radio and its spread of music over many miles added the influence of country music and Texas swing music.



The Cajun Accordian Most popular in Cajun music is the button accordion. It is basically a diatonic instrument. Musicians who play Zydeco (a related style of music) generally prefer the larger piano accordion. Cajun accordions were mostly made in Germany until WWII. However, bombing in the war destroyed the factories. At this time, button accordions began being crafted by hand in the United States. Among the many masters of the button accordion was Amédé Ardoin (1898-1942). His style was very influential through to the 1930's.

Though there are **Many performers** who spread this style of music, one is identified as the "godfather" of Cajun music. He was Harry Choates (1922-1951). In 1946 he recorded Jole Blon, a song considered the national anthem of Cajun music. During that time he also recorded <u>The Lake Charles Waltz</u>. There are several contemporary recordings of this tune. <u>The Guinea Pigs</u>, a trio (mandolin, autoharp and fiddle), do a fair effort with this tune.





Cajun music continued on **through the decades**. In the early 1950's, Hank Williams wrote and recorded *Jambalaya* a Cajun flavored tune. Later in the 1960's John Fogerty recorded it. It was a successful recording for them. In 1964 at the Newport Folk Festival, Dewey Balfa, Gladius Thibodeaux, and Vinus LeJeune, Cajun music makers, were invited to play among the lineup of the luminaries of that time such as Bob Dylan and Joan Baez.

Cajun music is **dance music**. When I was working in New Orleans, my hometown, during the 1970's, a co-worker asked me if I wanted to go to a cajun dance hall he had discovered near the airport. So we went to dinner with our wives and afterwards

headed out to a dancehall featuring <u>Allen Fontenot and his Country Cajuns</u>. We were somewhat disconcerted when we walked into a smoky pool hall. We had to walk to the back of the hall and pay a cover charge at a barred window. From there, we went through another entrance into a large dance hall. We were genuinely entertained by Allen Fontenot and his band. The band was together from 1970-2010. The dance floor was liberally sprinkled with sawdust. This is evidently an important requirement for the twostep. <u>Sample Dance Halls</u>




