

For a very long time, I thought Woody Guthrie had invented the Talking Blues, but Wikipedia tells me that Christopher Allen Bouchillon deserves that credit, for his Columbia recording "Talking Blues", in 1926. "Talking Dust Bowl Blues", Woody's first talking blues, came out in 1940. This form has been used by many other artists – especially by Bob Dylan – since then. The March of Technology

In October of 1887, Thomas Edison produced his first cylinder recording device. He is remembered in the manner of its first demonstration. He wanted to record words profound, but at the time of demonstration, all he could think to utter was "Mary had a little lamb, bah, bah, bah".

In the same year Emile Berliner produced the first disk recorder which he called the gramophone. It was a flat disk much like the 78 rpm disk to be produced in 1901 for the Victrolas. Emile Berliner is largely forgotten for his contribution. In 1949, the first 45 rpm record disk was introduced. The compact disk (CD) came out in 1982. The ".mp3" file, a compact digital format, was developed in 1991 from the digital ".wav" file which is of a higher volume. This was a march of technology that took 104 years to accomplish.

I tell you all that in order to mention this, in 1903, the Wright brothers made the first powered flight of an aircraft. In 1969, mankind, went to the moon. That was a march in technology of 66 years.
