Suffice it to say, Scott Sean White is a dedicated singer/songwriter and an artist that exudes emotion. His music is borne from real life experience, complete with the hopes, heartaches and happenstance that define that journey and the revelations that occur along the way.

Scott's success as a writer is firmly established. Major artists have recorded his songs and his own albums have topped the iTunes Singer-Songwriter charts. Scott started making trips once or twice a month back and forth from Texas to Nashville in 2005, signed his first

publishing deal in 2007, and for the last five years, has been there writing for his current publisher two weeks every month. And while he writes songs that can find a fit in the musical mainstream, he also makes it a point to write songs that are true to him. They tend to be so poignant, passionate and personal that only he could sing them. Funny enough, he never envisioned himself as an artist per se. He says that by the time he started making his trips to Nashville, he had outgrown the desire to be famous. "It just didn't interest me anymore," he insists. "My heart was in the off-thebeaten path songs that had some real meat on the bone. And that's not exactly commercial." ~<u>https://www.scottseanwhite.com/home</u>

SEPTEMBER FEATURED SONG

THE DEVIL IS A-WORKIN' IN A TEXIAN'S HEAD

This lively song was originally collected and recorded by John A. Lomax, Jr. During the first half of the nineteenth century, people in Texas were variously referred to as Texans, Texians or Texicans – all derived from a Native American word for "friend." Many of the military units who fought in the Texas Revolution (1835-1836) had "Texian" in their name. You can hear this song performed by Pete Seeger <u>here</u>, or on the <u>HFMS Audio Archive page</u>. To play along with Pete, capo II.

They'll take you to a house with a hewed log wall But it ain't got no windows at all With a clapboard roof and a puncheon floor That's the way all Texas o'er That's the way all Texas o'er.

When they come a'courtin' I'll tell you what they wear An old leather coat all patched and bare An old straw hat more brim than crown And a pair of dirty socks they've worn year 'round A pair of dirty socks they've worn year 'round.

Well, brandy's brandy any way you mix it A Texian's a Texian any way you fix it When other good folk have all gone to bed The devil is a-workin' in a Texian's head The devil is a-workin' in a Texian's head.







Herman Hupfield wrote **As Time Goes By** in 1932 and it became a classic from its use in the movie *Casa Blanca*. The lyrics expressed as everlasting the principles of romance. While this idea of romance may be widely understood and accepted, this may not be true of other songs which were once popular.

In the 50's and 60's companies that installed swimming pools were also involved in installing bomb shelters in the yards of those who had the means to do so. In 1963, Bob Dylan wrote and sang **The Talking WWIII Blues**, it contained the lyrics:

"I was down in the sewer with some little lover,

When I peeked out from a manhole cover

Wondering who turned the lights on...

I lit a cigarette on a parking meter, And walked on down the road."

Today's generation may not understand his reference nor know about the "duck and cover" bomb drills that students experienced.

The Cotton Eye(d) Joe was a popular song that spawned a line dance. The dance was featured in the 1980 movie, "Urban Cowboy." The tune predates the American Civil War, and the "cotton eyed Joe" referred to one who is drunk on moonshine or worse yet, one who has gone blind by drinking wood alcohol which causes the eyes to become milky white.

In Green Green Rocky Road a song by Dave von Rock, there is a verse ...

"Ooka Dooka Soda cracker, does your momma chew tobacco,

If your momma chews tobacco, sing ooka dooka soda cracker"

Dave von Rock said this was a chant the children engaged in to warn their parents that police had entered the neighborhood. One source indicates the chant was used by the children whose mothers were sometimes arrested as prostitutes. These women were not allowed to smoke in jail, so they chewed tobacco. Moreover, the food they were given included moldy bread. So they carried soda crackers with them.

In 1972, Helen Reddy sang out "I am woman, hear me roar"! Such statements uttered today have become a matter of controversy, for example by those in athletic competitions. As Bob Dylan once sang, "The times, they are a'changing".




