







During the American Civil War, there was the production of cigar box string instruments made by the soldiers. This tradition continued on through to World War I. The image below shows samples of the type of instruments that were crafted.

While these instruments are remarkable for their and ingenuity the condition under which they were constructed by men in combat, there are some examples of excellent violins constructed by prisoners of war during World War II. The first example is that of made by Clair Cline a U. S. Air Corps B-24 pilot who was shot



down over occupied Holland and sent to Stalag Luft I prison in Germany. His basic materials were slats from the camp beds and excess glue scraped from the crude furniture in the camp. His story has been dramatized in a 2017 movie, "Instrument of War".



Violin Built by Clair Cline There was also a German prisoner sent to a POW camp in Essex, England who completed a violin. While, I do not have his story, there is a video here of it being played after it had gone through a restoration.


