# Anatomy of a Musical Moment

The collage of “Musical Moments” above is composed of images from the lives of people young and old and perhaps of very different backgrounds. The lady on the street is a concert harpist who found herself in a monumental traffic jam, so she took out her harp to entertain. The elderly man appears to be enjoying a moment’s respite. He may be a victim of war or a natural disaster. Nevertheless, they are each having a moment enjoying a simple pleasure. This is made possible by one of six circuits in the auditory cortex of the brain.

MIT conducted a study using fMRI (function magnetic resonance imaging) on human subjects. The stimulus consisted of 165 sounds of various types, some of these sounds being musical. In a very brief summary, most all sounds were processed in 5 of the 6 auditory circuits. Music was the only sound to be processed by the 6th circuit. How wonderful it is that humanity has been exercising this circuit throughout the world and far back into prehistory when Neanderthals made flutes from hollow bones of birds.


