## A SONG PRESERVED BY ERIC JOHNSON

Sometime in the late 1970's, Eric received from his brother a copy of a radio show broadcast in Washington, DC. It was a recording of Richard K. Spotswood program. R.K. Spotswood (b.1937) is a musicologist and author from Maryland who has catalogued and been responsible for the reissue of many thousands of recordings of vernacular music in the United States. From this tape, Eric learned a song recorded by Walter Lee Moore (1914-1997), a long time country western performer who traveled across the country with a variety of groups. The song is called "Where The Water Lilies Grow". It is one of Eric's more moving and melodic tunes.
