Roy Book Binder



Singer-songwriter and storytelling bluesman Roy Book Binder has been rambling around the world for the past 45 years. He gave up his Greenwich Village "pad" in the early 70's and lived in his "Tour Bus" for the next 15 years crisscrossing the US and appearing at festivals throughout Canada & Europe. Roy is considered a walking encyclopedia of blues music, artists and lore. He has authored five video tutorials for the well-respected Homespun Lessons, and has nine CDs currently available, on top of numerous previous vinyl records and tapes. Roy has been one of the legends of acoustic music for a long time, and we are delighted to have him on our stage at Second Saturday.

Book Binder, travelled with the legendary Rev. Gary Davis in the late 60's. He recorded his first solo acoustic Blues album in the 70's, which was the first to receive 5 stars in DOWNBEAT magazine. In the late 80's 'The Book' was part of Bonnie Raitt's East Coast Tour, which included an appearance on The Grand Old Opry which led to almost 30 appearances on NASHVILLE NOW's Ralph Emory Show. In the 90's he often appeared with JORMA KAUKONEN (who recorded 2 of Roy's songs)

In August, 2013, THE GOOD BOOK, Roy's latest release of all original songs, reached #3 on AirPlayDirect's Americana charts. #1 was Guy Clark & #2 was the late Townes Van Zandt. Folkdj.org had Roy in the top 3 artists for July, 2013. Our upcoming May, 2019 concert promises to be a memorable one. Put May 11 on your calendar and join us for a great evening!

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the Houston Folklore/Music Society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and folk/acoustic music. 

Kinky Friedman's Circus of Life

I am not that familiar with the music of Kinky Friedman, so I really didn't know what to expect when my brother gifted me with "Circus of Life." It took me several listenings to capture the gist of some of the selections, so I hope this review does justice to the CD.

To me, Kinky's voice has a raspy quality of Dylan with a little bit of Tom Waits thrown in.

"Circus of Life" is a collection of vignettes of characters such as "Jesus in Pajamas," concerning a homeless man who hangs around in a Denny's restaurant hoping to find food, but also contains some positive presentations of personages as well. "A Dog Named Freedom" has overtones of "Me And You And A Dog Named Boo" in it, but is nevertheless worth a listen. "Autographs In The Rain (Song to Willie)" is an ode to the great humanity of Willie Nelson, one of Friedman's early musical heroes.

"Back To Grace" is an attempt to get back to a lover while Friedman seems to be in a drunken stupor. "Sister Sara" laments the loss of what could have been in a relationship. "Song About You" explores the attempt to write the perfect love song.

"Spitfire" takes place in wartime, and expresses admiration for the WWII British fighter plane of that name. "No one can fly higher/Than my little Spitfire/I love you/Always have/ And always will."

"Me & My Guitar" is an ode to the special relationship between a musician and his beloved instrument with existential overtones: "All I am is me and my guitar." "Zoe" expresses the complications of longing for what cannot be: "Zoe...I know you'll never be my wife...Zoe, I want you always in my life..."

"Sayin' Goodbye," Kinky sings ...is never easy: "All of my life I've been busy...Dreamin' of sayin' goodbye." It seems to be the best song to close this CD.

Friedman is a master of a wide variety of song genres. Don't let his rough appearance fool you, but, rather, let him welcome you into his "Circus of Life." You will be truly amazed.
