John Flynn





John Flynn sings from the heart. His powerful songs of humanity and hope are deeply rooted in the traditions of **Woody Guthrie** and **Phil Ochs**. John paints vivid, lasting images with words and music, drawn from a palette of awareness, irony, humor, and compassion. John's artistic journey has taken him from Temple University, where he earned a degree in Political Science, to Nashville's Music Row as a songwriter, to award-winning children's recording artist and performer, to social justice activist. John is truly an American troubadour.

John has shared the stage with some of the greats of our time, **Willie Nelson, Arlo Guthrie**, **Kris Kristofferson**, to name a few. Arlo invited John to join his *Train to New Orleans* tour post-Hurricane Katrina, and Kris Kristofferson has not only sung on two of John's CDs, but has given John previously unrecorded material to use. **Sonny Ochs**, the sister of the late great songwriter, Phil Ochs, has made John one of the mainstays of her *Phil Ochs Song Nights* that tours nationally.

John walks his talk. When off the road, he leads a prison discussion group, is very involved with **Camp Dreamcatcher**, a safe haven for children living with and affected by HIV/AIDS, and is an advocate for wider understanding and treatment of PTSD suffered by our returning war veterans.

Second Saturday Concert is presented by the **Houston Folklore/Music Society**, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the preservation of folklore and folk/acoustic music. Coffee, water, cookies and sandwiches—are available. Tickets are sold at the door adults \$18, students (with ID), senior citizens (65) \$14, and children under 12 free with adults. The Way We Were: Robert K.

Over the years, there have been some rather unique visitors to our song circles. One such was a young fellow named Robert. He would take the bus from his place of work to visit with us at the Unitarian Church in downtown Houston. He would accompany himself on a guitar borrowed from within the circle as he often sang television themes from western television shows. He also sang French and German folk songs during his visits. One might refer to his personality as socially awkward. Will Damewood and I took turns driving Robert home after the meetings. Thus we got to know him a little better. He worked at several odd jobs. One of which he was proud to be hired for was that of a census taker for the US government. In 1994, the movie "Ed Wood" was released in theaters. Ed Wood was an eccentric cross-dressing individual who dreamed that he could make movies in Hollywood. It starred Johnny Depp and Martin Landau. Martin Landau won an Oscar for best supporting actor in his role of Bela Lugosi. Robert was delighted by this movie. So much so, that he wrote "The Ballad of Ed Wood". His ballad does a fine job in covering all of the key elements of the film. Robert left Houston to care for his aging mother. After her death, he visited us once again on a return trip to the Houston area.

PICKIN'

We had a fine pickin party at Anderson Fair Sunday, and thanks to Tim Leatherwood and the volunteers for hosting us. It was unfortunate that we didn't even get around the circle twice, and some folks only got to do one song. In part, that's the price of having a successful program: We had a lot of people there. It's also a good occasion for thinking about how we can be considerate of one another and make the circles work as smoothly and as user-friendly as possible.

Obviously, when we're time-limited, the more we talk the less we're going to be able to play. If we average spending as much time talking about the songs as playing them, then 50% of our time is going into talking. Also, to reiterate a few suggestions we've circulated in the past (but not lately): 1) Tasteful playing of fills, background accompaniment, harmony singing, is fine, as long as the singer is the principal thing we hear. Don't forget that the song belongs to the person doing it – we will each have our turn in the spotlight. One can always request no playing along if it's a new song, or they feel the playing would be distracting to them. 2) We need to be ready to go when our turn comes. The less time spent tuning, borrowing somebody's stand, finding our lead sheets – the more time for singing.

Generally, it's a "do unto others..." thing. If we have to tune, then we need to tune. If we want to talk about how this song relates to the story of our life, keep in mind that we can save that for some time when we have a small group.
